

Free Application for Federal Student Aid 2019-2020

If you will be attending Cuesta fall **2019**, the **Cuesta Promise** requires filing the 2019-2020 FAFSA or Dream Application by August 1, 2019.

The **FAFSA** is a joint application for federal and state financial aid.

The **Dream Application** is for State of California financial aid that is available to non-residents. This includes the Cal-Grant and California Promise Grant (previously known as the Board of Governor's Waiver-BOG).

The **deadline for the California Cal-Grant is March 2.**

GPA's for the **Cal-Grant** were submitted electronically in October for seniors. Students now have two years to qualify. If a qualifying GPA is achieved by graduation in June, the GPA can be resubmitted.
